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About This Statement

Steel Hawk Berhad (“**Steel Hawk**” or “**Group**”) proudly presents our inaugural Sustainability Statement for Financial Year 2022. This statement documents our concerted efforts to implement our environmental, social, and governance initiatives and performance for this fiscal year and marks the bedrock of our path to achieving our sustainability aspirations in line with the ultimate global sustainability agenda. As a provider of innovative solutions involving new technology for the local and international energy industry, we have embraced our role in the drive toward achieving our ESG goals for a sustainable future. This statement provides our stakeholders with insights into the Group’s approach to integrating sustainability into our business and our journey of value creation over the long term. The scope of this statement encompasses Steel Hawk's principal subsidiary, Steel Hawk Engineering Sdn Bhd ("**SHESB**"), and the operations in Kemaman, Kerteh, and Miri, in addition to the Group's headquarters in Petaling Jaya, Selangor.

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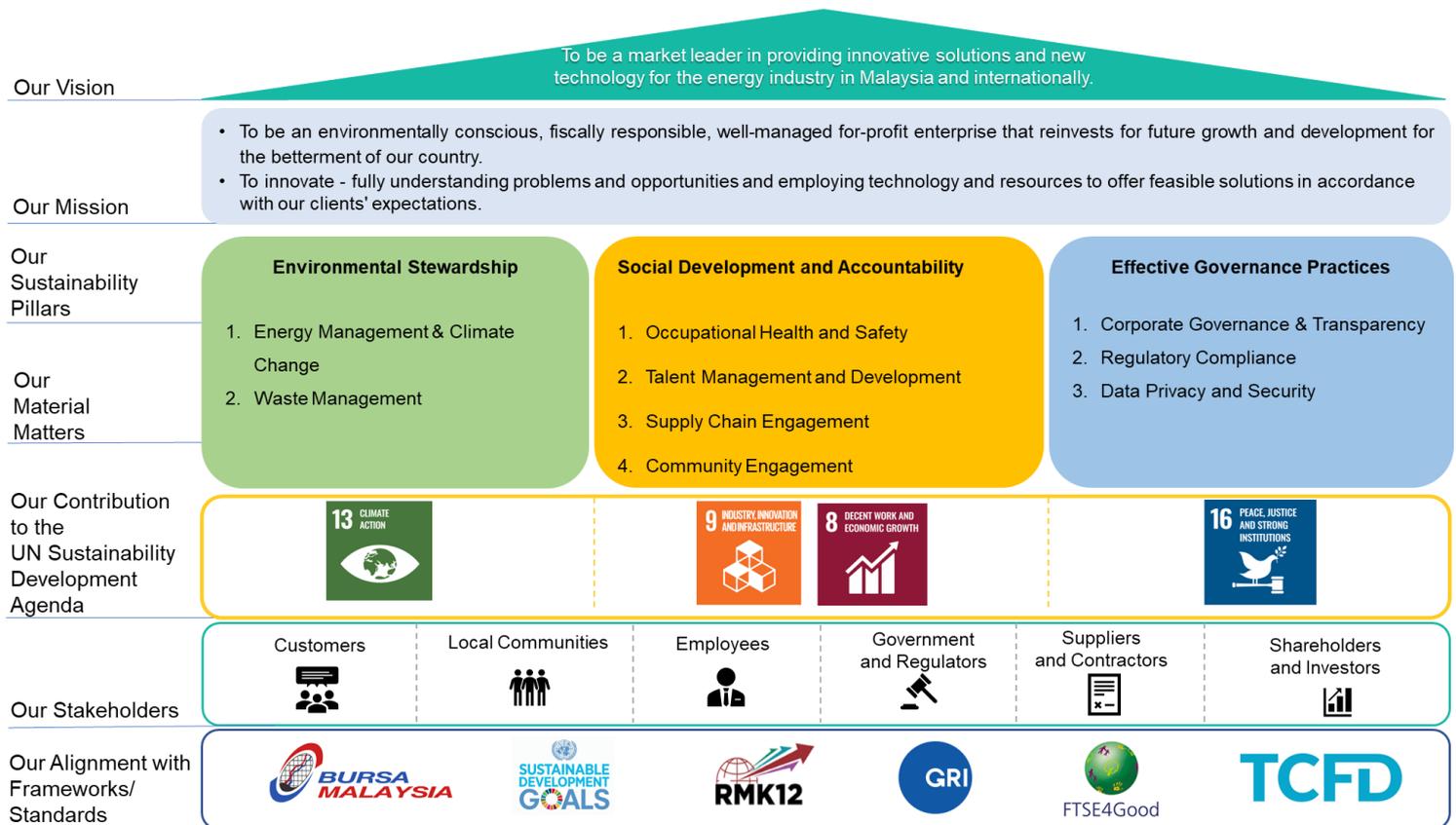
Assurance

With the exception of financial data, we have not sought third-party assurance for the ESG data disclosed in this statement. Our near-term plan is to establish an internal audit team to process our data.

Sustainability Framework

Our framework is skewed towards the 12th Malaysia Plan, focusing on transitioning towards a low-carbon pathway through one of the focus areas in advancing green growth for sustainability and resilience. Aligning with the global trend, we aim to meet Bursa's Requirements by 2025 in terms of the Task Force on Climate-Related Financial Disclosures ("TCFD") Recommendations.

Sustainability Governance Structure

A robust sustainability governance structure is fundamental to driving the ESG initiative across the Group's operations. We have developed a three-tiered governance structure to oversee the performance of all sustainability-related matters.

The Board of Directors (**the "Board"**) monitors the Group's four (4) subsidiaries' sustainability strategies at the pinnacle of the governance structure, supported by the Sustainability Committee (**"SC"**) led by the Chairman. The Sustainability Committee comprises respective Heads of Departments who oversee the implementation of the Group's sustainability programmes and activities on a daily basis.

The Group developed a Sustainability Policy to support the Sustainability Statement, which has been reviewed and approved by the Board for implementation in Steel Hawk's operations.

Steel Hawk's Sustainability Policy outlines the Group's commitment to creating a sustainable future. This document was also established to streamline our existing policies related to ESG aspects and define the foundations governing ESG initiatives and strategies. 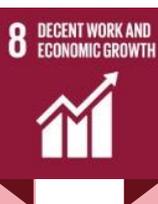

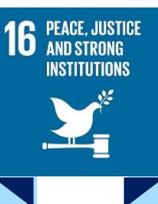

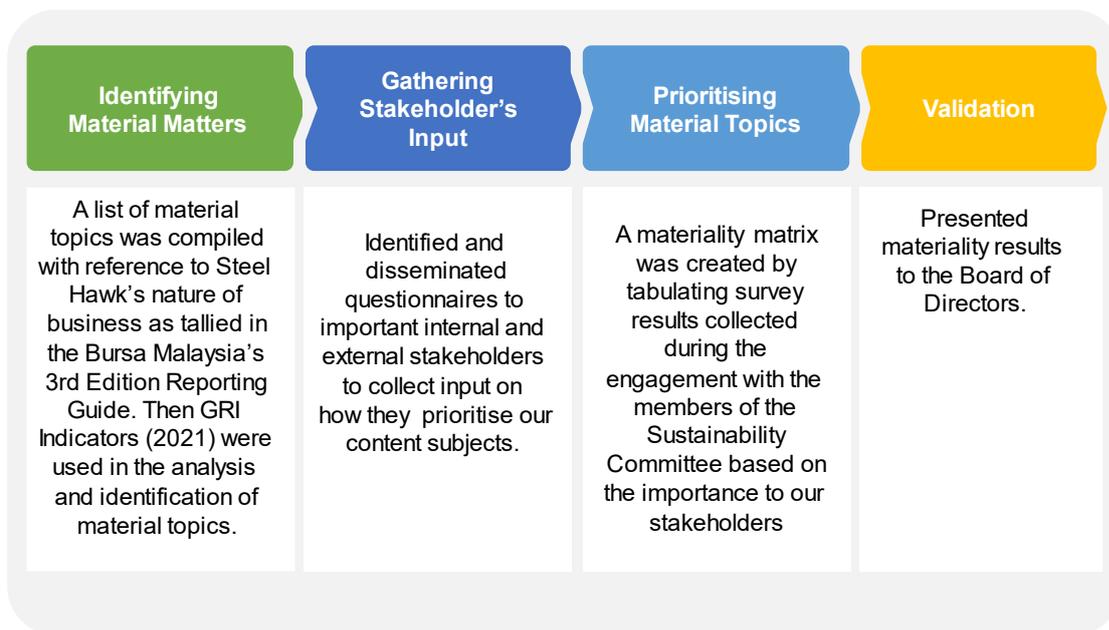

Materiality Assessment

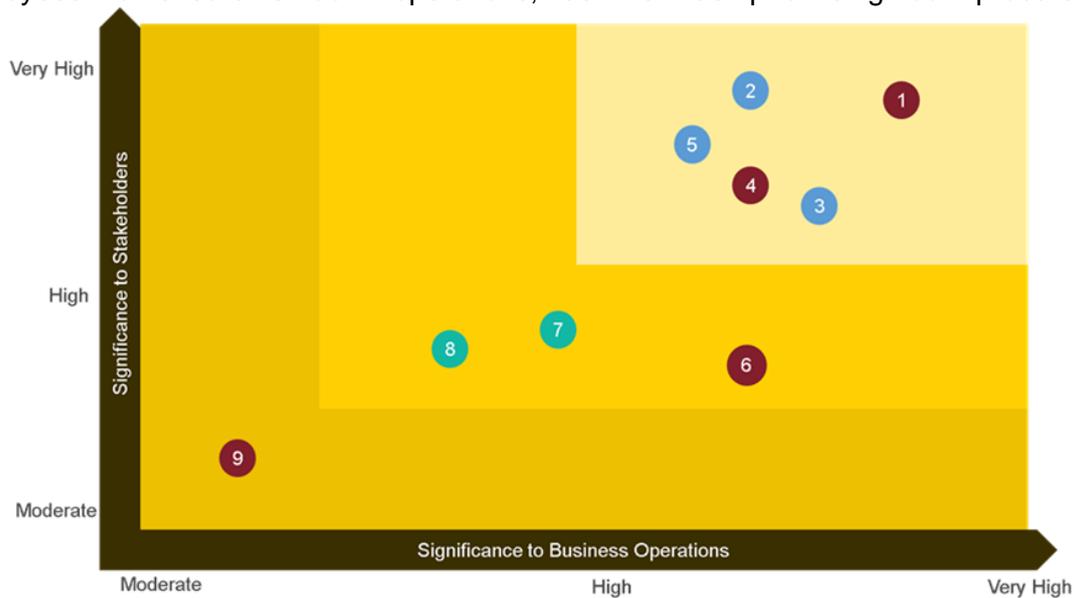

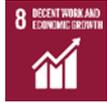

Corporate Governance and Transparency

The Board of Directors (**“the Board”**) is guided by an internal Board Charter (**“the Charter”**) which has been established according to the principles and best practices of the Malaysian Code on Corporate Governance, 2021 (**“MCCG”**).

Serving to inform Directors of their roles and responsibilities during their term, The Charter outlines the standards of professional behaviour expected of them. It is reviewed regularly by the Board to ensure relevance and suitability with the latest regulatory requirements.

The values, principles and expectations of professional conduct are further upheld through the Group’s Code of Behaviour and Ethics (**the “Code”**). The Code contains clear guidelines on how employees and associates are expected to behave, as well as the disciplinary actions in the event of non-compliance. Therefore, the Code should be read alongside these Policies.

Upholding a Bribe-Free Culture of Transparency

Promoting a transparent, zero-bribery culture within the Group is among our chief priorities to ensure integrity and accountability within the company. Though we have long since established our Anti-Bribery Policy which acts as a guide to principled workplace practices for our employees, we have aligned with the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission’s Corporate Integrity System (**“CISM”**) to further improve how we address corruption and improve our credibility.

To accomplish this, the Group has also signed the Corporate Integrity Pledge (**“CIP”**) which sets the principles that corporations can adopt to ensure a fair and transparent business environment, further demonstrating our commitment to combating corruption.

Data Privacy and Security

The COVID-19 pandemic has accelerated the acceptance of the "new normal" in internet interaction and operations. Cyberattack susceptibility has increased as a result of the adoption of remote working modes and the rapid expansion of digital technology.

Businesses are placing an increasing value on the personal and financial data that they produce, gather, and retain. Therefore, it is crucial to safeguard such data from dangers like data breaches. The Personal Data Protection Act ("PDPA") 2010, the law that regulates the gathering, use, disclosure, and maintenance of personal data, guides how Steel Hawk does business. In accordance with the PDPA of 2010, we offer our employees and customers with a Personal Data Protection Notice that describes the purpose of processing personal data and any disclosures of such data.

To further ensure data security, we have implemented a number of technological and organisational security measures.



Preventative Maintenance

Preventative maintenance will be conducted bi-annually to ensure all IT in Steel Hawk are operating in satisfactory conditions.

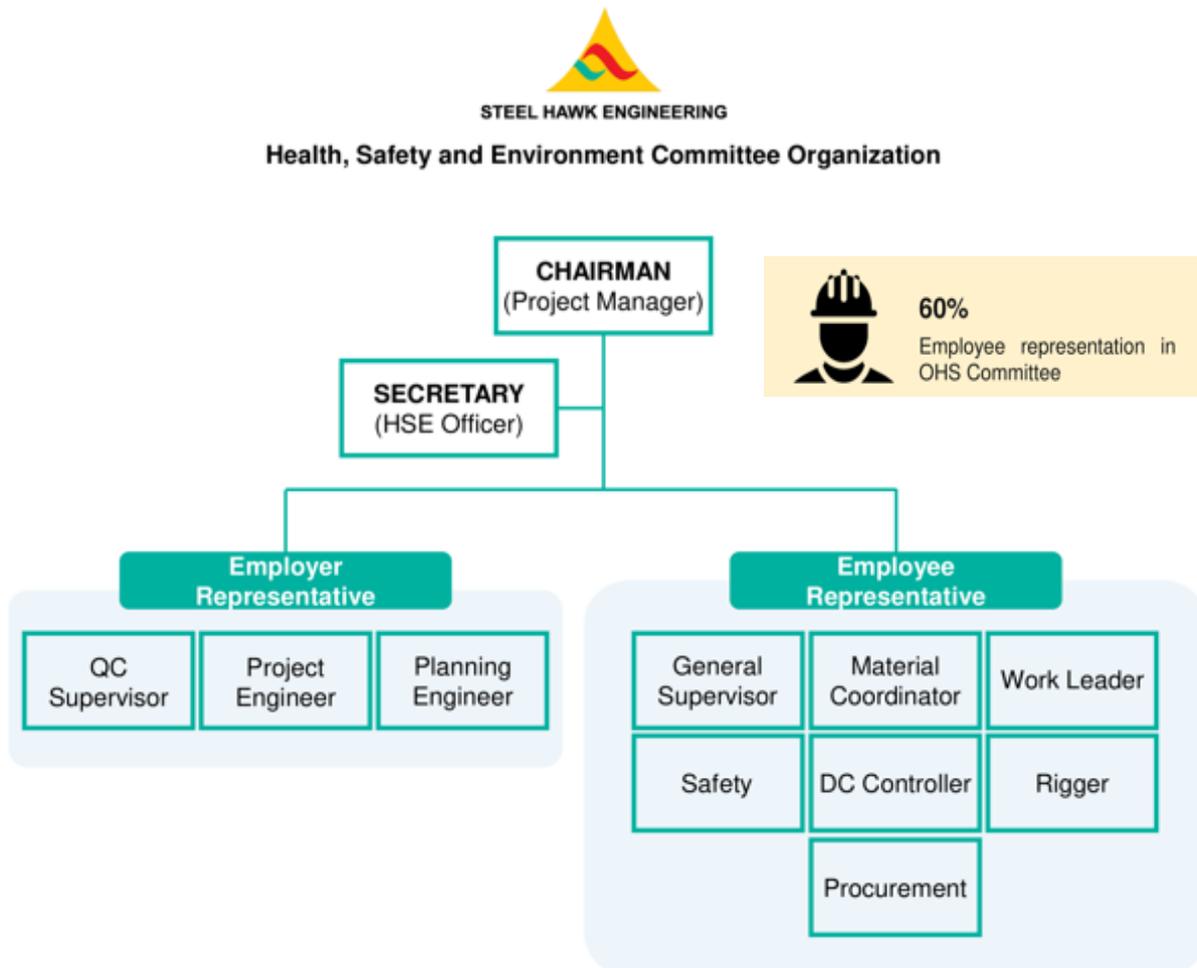
To prevent cybersecurity attacks, we installed Sophos Endpoint Protection, an intrusion prevention system that includes antimalware and data lost prevention ("DLP").

Ensuring the health and safety of our workforce, regardless of subsidiaries, is a primary commitment for enhancing our Group's productivity. Steel Hawk's Quality Health and Safety Management System ("QHS") establishes a safe and secure working environment for everyone through implementation initiatives, key procedures, and a guiding policy.

HSE Committee as the Pillar of OHS



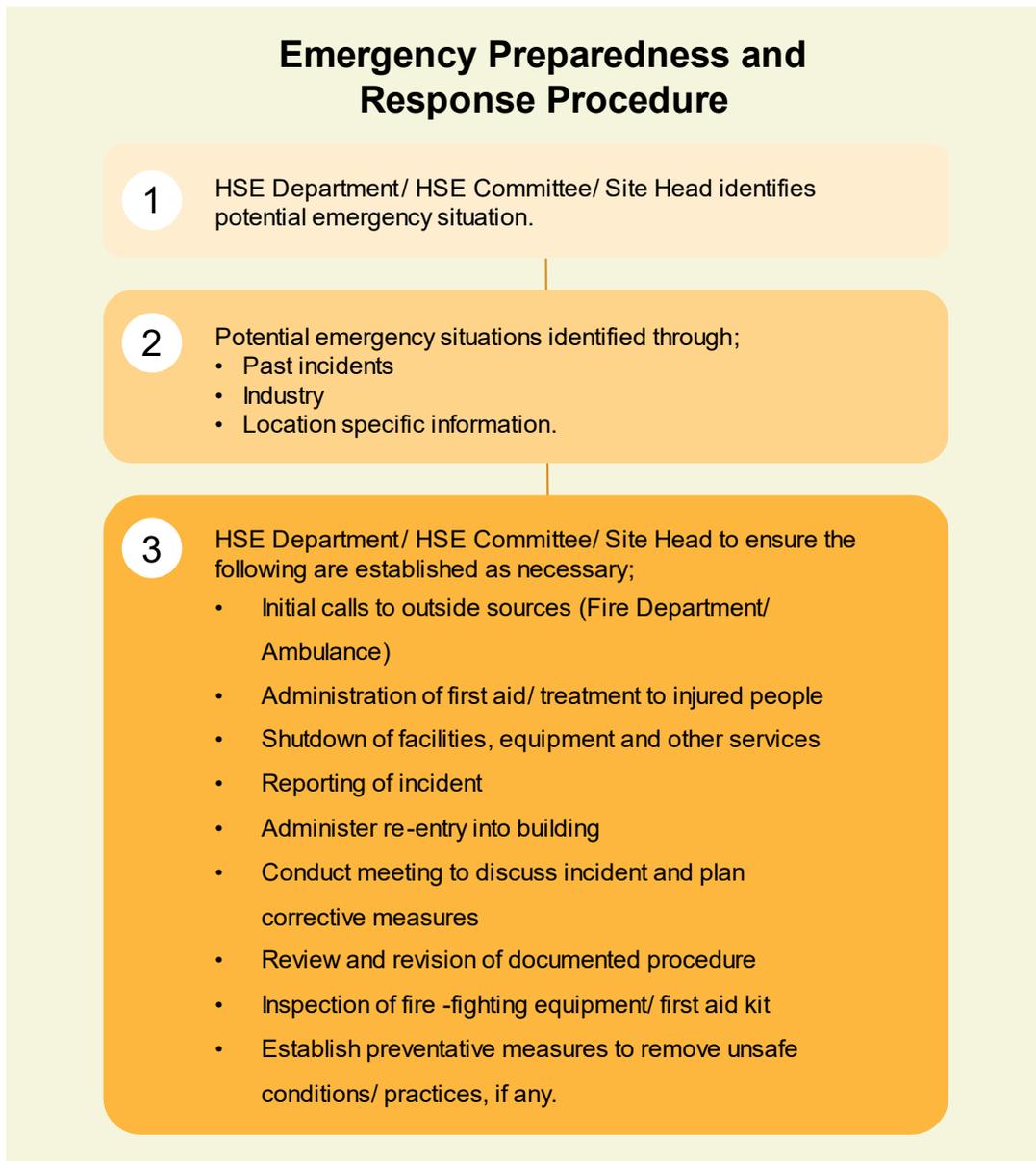
Quality Health and Safety Management System (QHS)

Our Group will be safeguarded against financial, operational, and legal repercussions with a robust system in place. As a market leader in innovative solutions and new technologies, our QHS system has been customised for the engineering service sector to include relevant procedures. We recognise the significance of incorporating a certified system into our operations; thus, Steel Hawk is proud to announce that we are ISO 9001:2015 certified. For the duration of 2022, our operations have been subject to rigorous internal and external audits in an effort to achieve ISO 45001 accreditation. Internal auditors evaluate the efficacy of the system to ensure that it complies with both ISO 9001 and ISO 14001, while top management assesses the system's structure and provides feedback.

Health, Safety, and Environment ("HSE") Policy is synchronised with the Hazard Identification, Risk Assessment and Risk Control ("HIRARC") Procedure as a guiding document for the OHS management of our operations. HIRARC assists us in identifying risks and executing mitigation measures accordingly. In the event of any incidents, an investigation and report will be conducted in compliance with the regulations. This is to ensure that incidents are reported in a timely manner and that their causes are identified so mitigation measures can be undertaken towards achieving zero lost-time injuries ("LTI") and fatalities. As of 2022, we were able to log 250,260 working hours with zero LTIs and fatalities.



Steel Hawk has an Emergency Preparedness and Response Procedure in the event that unforeseen events endanger the safety of our workforce, regardless of whether we embed a system within our operations to address OHS risks.

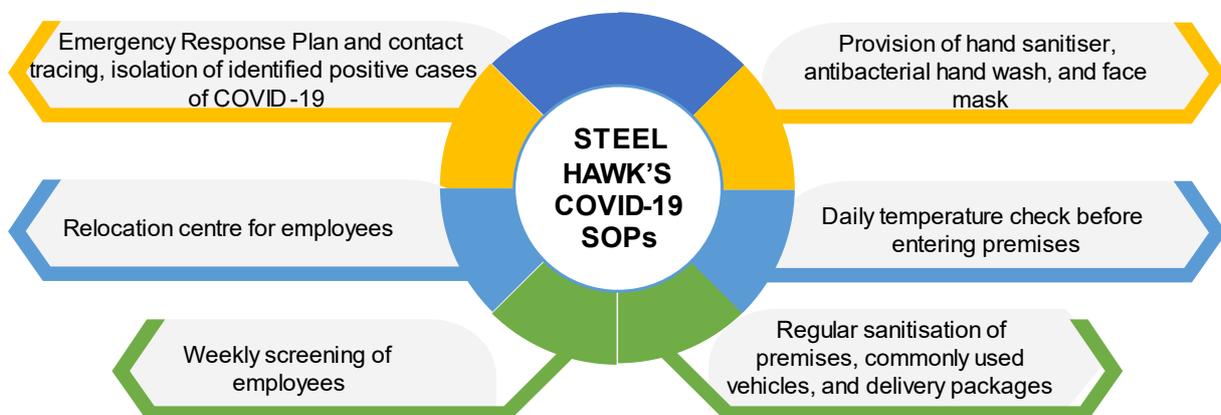

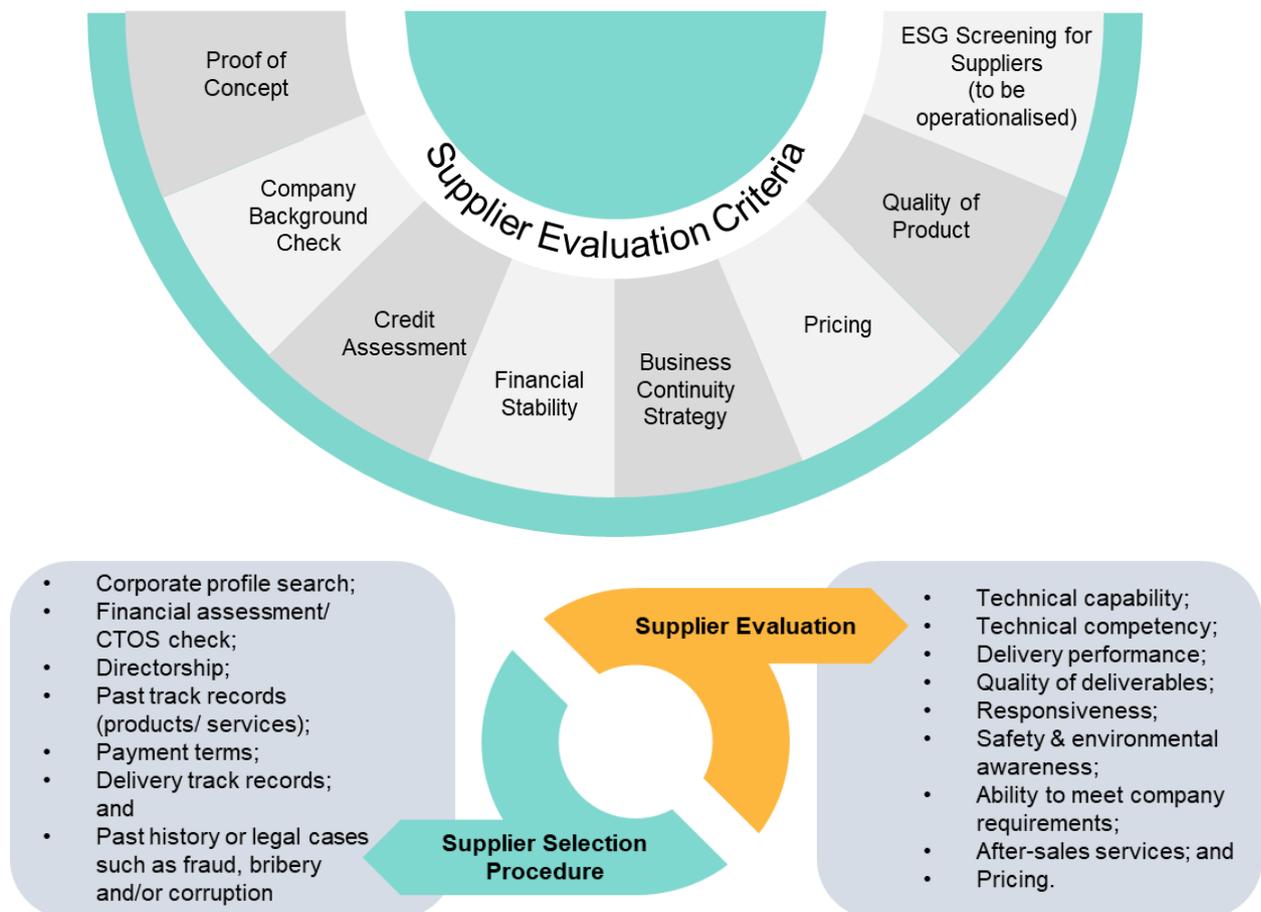
To safeguard the health of our employees during FY2022, we extended COVID-19 preventative measures despite transitioning into the endemic phase. The Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) in Malaysia were updated in 2022, and we have incorporated the Ministry of Health's revisions.



Supply Chain Engagement

In our Subcontracting & Management Policy & Procedure, we prioritise ethical business practises, and we expect our suppliers to adhere to the same values. We expect all our suppliers, service providers, and other third-party vendors to do business in accordance with Steel Hawk's values.

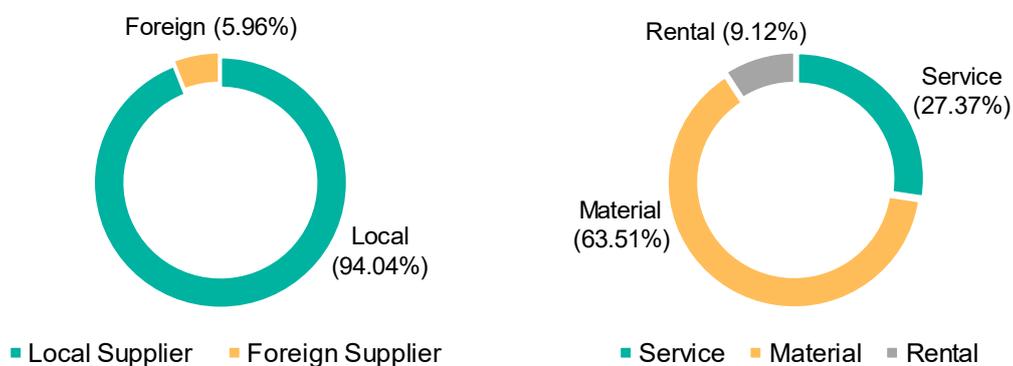
As indicated in the table below, we have taken steps toward a more sustainable supply chain by implementing stringent supplier selection criteria and performance evaluations. The Procurement Executive is responsible for implementing these regulations.



Upholding Our Local Suppliers

We prioritise the acquisition of goods and services from local suppliers who meet our requirements, and we frequently source items locally first. We seek to contribute to the economic success of our local communities while strengthening the resilience of the domestic supply chain.

In 2022, we expended RM19,800,147.80 on materials and services from local vendors, accounting for 94.78% of our entire procurement expenditure. We have demonstrated our commitment to local suppliers by ensuring their appointment in the vast majority of cases (94.04%). We focus more on material supplies as the source of procurement for our operations.

Steel Hawk assists Petronas in managing and developing local Bumiputera small and medium-scale industry vendors in the oil and gas-related services market.

The employees of Steel Hawk are our most valuable asset, as they are the primary drivers of our operations, and their performances directly impact the value of our business. We are committed to investing in our employees and ensuring that they have access to opportunities for technical, professional, and personal growth. By doing so, we strive to equip our employees with the knowledge and skills necessary for professional success.

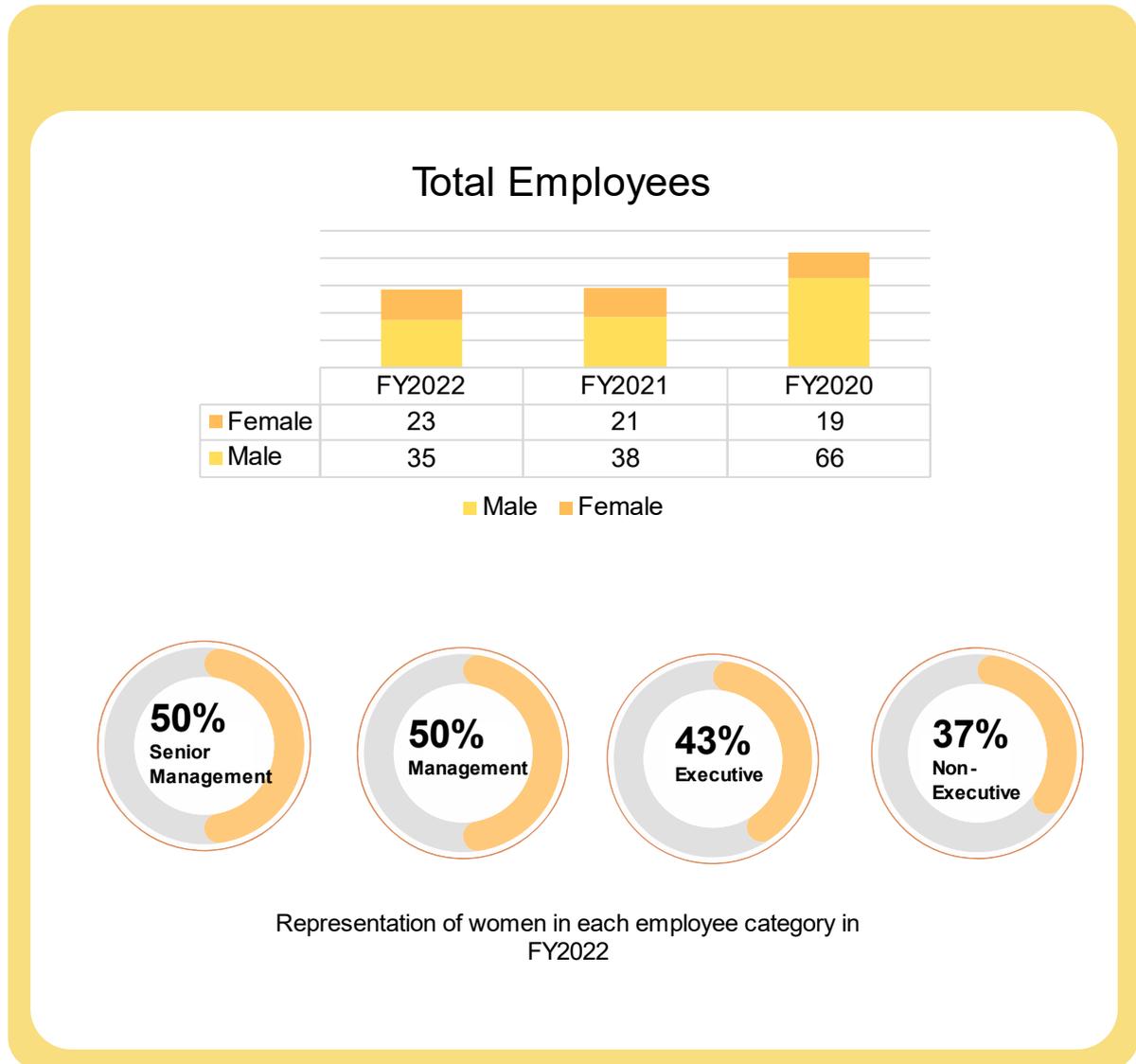
Diversity and Inclusion

Steel Hawk Berhad has thrived in a culture of inclusivity, diversity, and respect. We have made a focused effort to create a diverse environment and workforce. By embracing diversity and inclusion, we are able to draw from a larger talent pool, cultivate fresh perspectives, and improve our business. We provide all of our employees, regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, or nationality, with equal opportunities for professional advancement. To foster a meritocratic and inclusive society, we strive to quell stereotypes and prejudices.

The majority of our current workforce is male due to the nature of the work in the oil and gas engineering services sector, but we encourage more female applicants to join our team in the future. Our current talent pool is made up of 56 employees, including 17 new hires. Male employees outnumbered female employees, even among new hires. Because of their work experiences, employees ranging in age from 30 to 50 years old made up the majority this year. With 17 hires, we recorded a turnover of 8 employees.

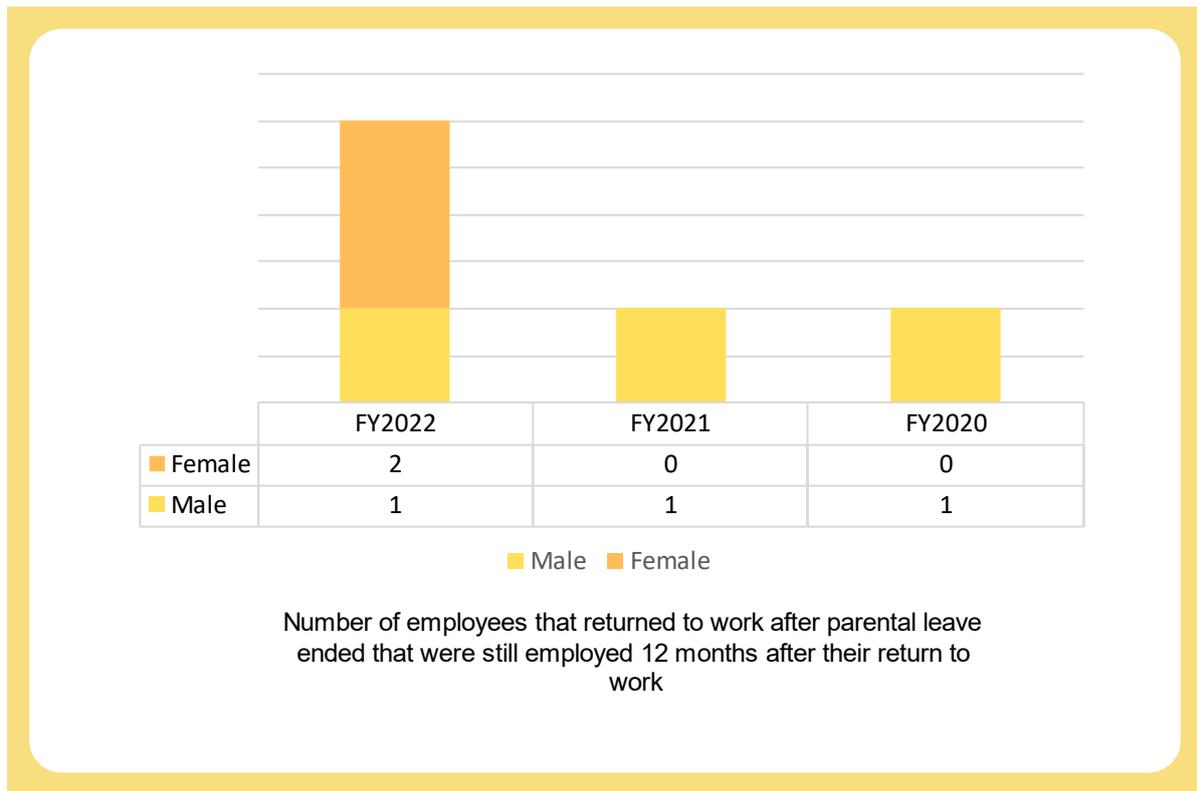
With 50% of women in senior and management positions, we have demonstrated our commitment to female representation in our workforce. Women held more than a quarter of positions in the executive and non-executive sectors. Steel Hawk adheres to the Malaysian Code on Corporate Governance (MCCG), 2021, which controls the selection and appointment of Board members and senior management. MCCG establishes objective standards based on merit while taking into account diversity in abilities, experience, age, cultural background, and gender.

In 2020 and 2021, only one employee took maternity leave, and remained under our employment upon returning to work 12 months. This year, a male and two female employees took parental leave and then returned to work.

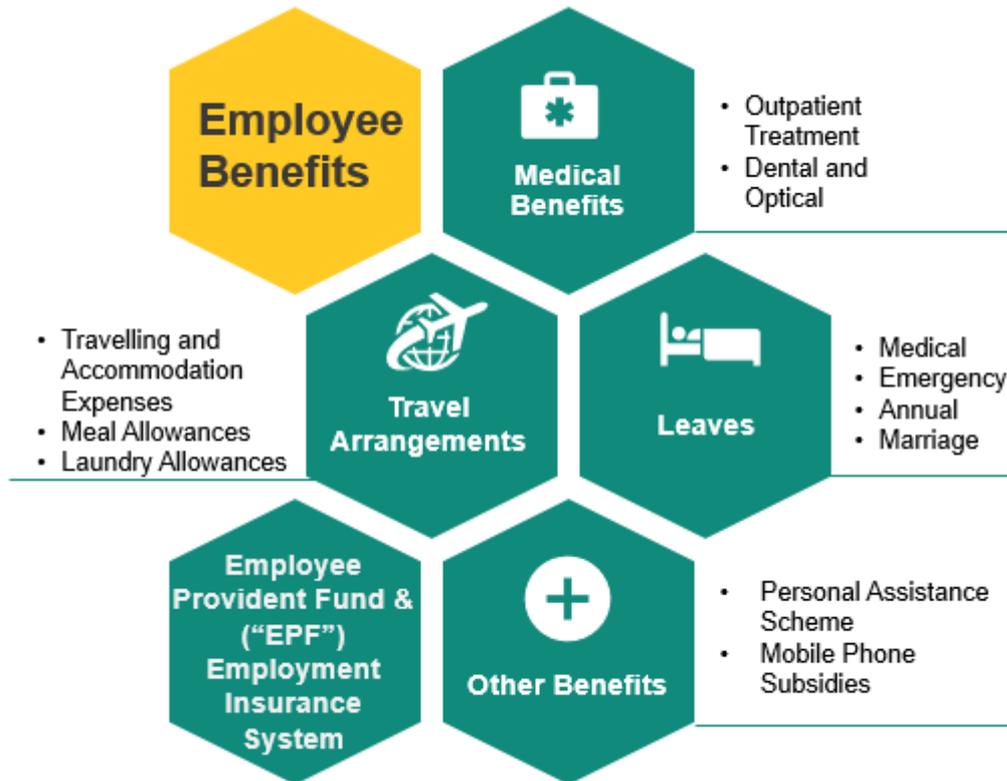


Promoting Anti-Discrimination

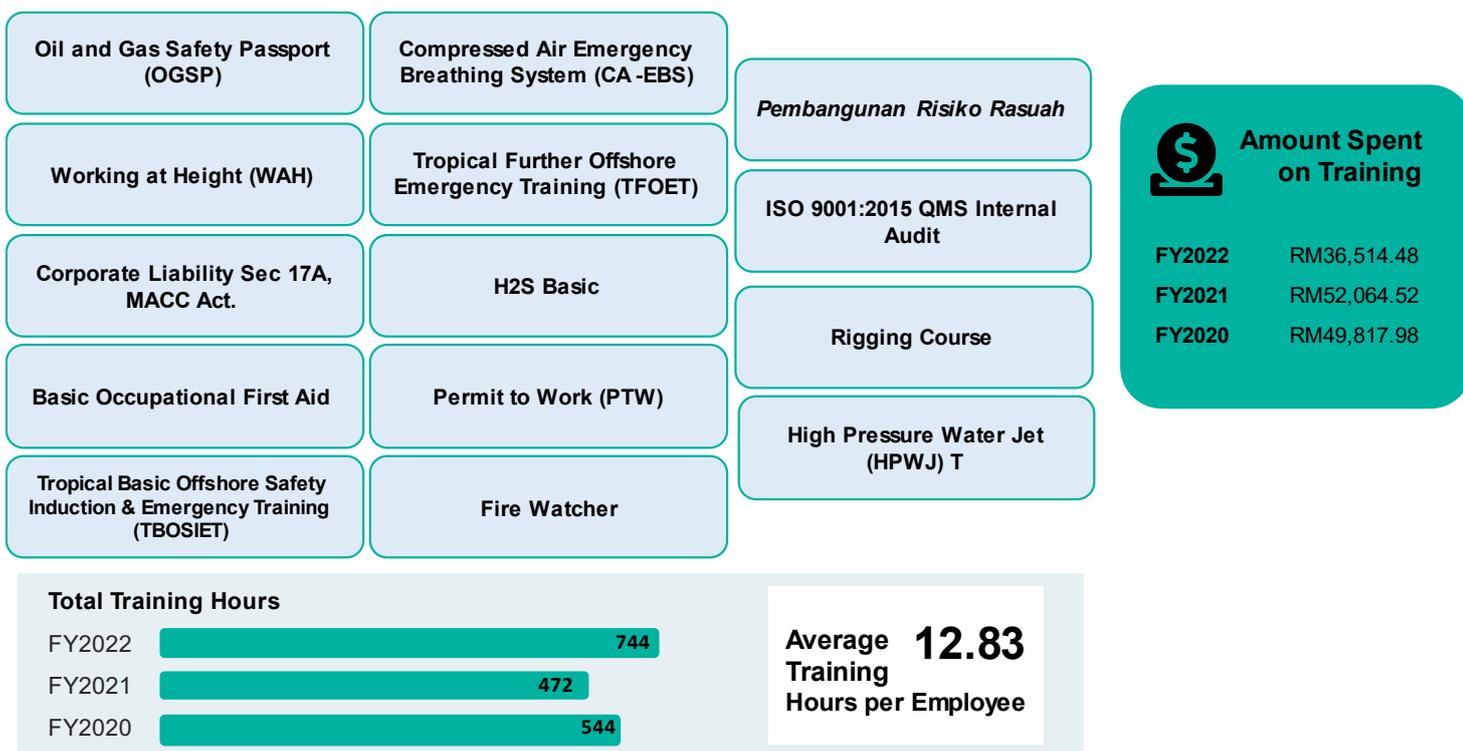

These features are Motivational Content, Relaxation Activities, Chatting with Qualified Listeners known as Vibers, who assess the overall mental state of users, and finally Mental Health Modules and Assessments.

Employee Engagement, Training and Development

Access to meaningful growth and development opportunities is a critical component of Steel Hawk's efforts to cultivate a skilled, competent, and adaptive workforce. To provide our employees with the skills necessary to attain their full potential, we offer a variety of training and development programmes.

Employee Training in FY2022:



All employees will undergo a Training Needs Analysis (“TNA”), and the resulting data will be applied to develop an Annual Training Plan. The Human Resources Department of the Group conducts an annual performance appraisal to assess the progress of our employees. Each employee is subject to the Performance Improvement Plan (“PIP”) in order to determine the extent to which they have met the required criteria. With this in place, Steel Hawk is able to develop relevant training for the talent development of our workforce.

Community Investment

Community engagement must begin with a high level of trust before any development or change can actually occur. It is an opportunity to promote the empowerment and wellbeing of the local community where we work. Giving back to the community also enables us to play an active role in community development, learn to work together, and foster a feeling of community, enhancing our long-term social commitment to the welfare of these communities. Sponsorship

Waste Management

The nature of Steel Hawk's business is oil and gas servicing which generates scheduled and non-scheduled waste. For the scheduled waste we are currently utilising contractors licensed by the Department of Environment Malaysia to collect, transport, and dispose of our offshore waste.

To improve waste management practices, we organised a Scheduled Waste Awareness Programme for our subcontractors. We intend to enhance our commitment towards tracking our waste generation by putting in place a formal recording system.

Energy Management and Climate Change

Steel Hawk is cognisant of the need to protect the environment for the wellbeing of present and future generations. We are committed to minimising our environmental footprint by reducing the quantity of resources we consume, establishing ethical waste management methods, and encouraging our employees to exercise environmental stewardship.

The Group makes an effort to control environmental impacts created by all of our commercial operations in an ethical manner. On this front, we strive to reduce our carbon footprint, manage our resource consumption, and integrate environmental concerns into every step of our value chain.

Energy Management

Steel Hawk strives to identify opportunities to increase energy efficiency by continuously monitoring and analysing internal operations. We introduced our first green initiative for our staff to raise awareness and embrace low-carbon practices. We look toward implementing more progressive initiatives in the future to establish our place in effective energy management.

Initiative in Energy Saving

Green Initiative

In accordance with the effort to reduce carbon emissions, we played our role by encouraging our workforce to commute via bicycle within the facilities in our Miri and Kerteh offices instead of driving four-wheeled vehicles.

A total of 100 bicycles were provided to the employees for this initiative.



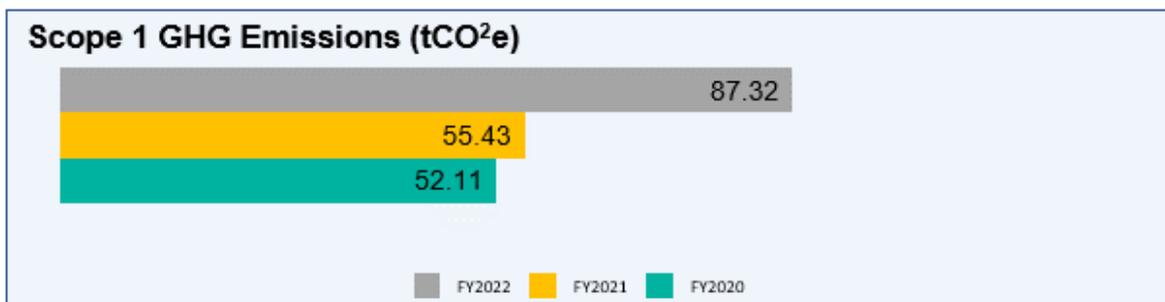
GHG Emissions

For this reporting period, we calculated our Scope 1 and Scope 2 greenhouse gas ("GHG") emissions. Scope 1 emissions are defined as direct emissions caused by the combustion of carbon fuel sources, which are estimated by converting our total fuel consumption to total CO₂ released using a diesel fuel emission factor¹. We utilised the grid emission factor² for Peninsular Malaysia to convert total energy consumption into total CO₂ emissions for our Scope 2 emissions, which are defined as indirect emissions caused by grid electricity use.

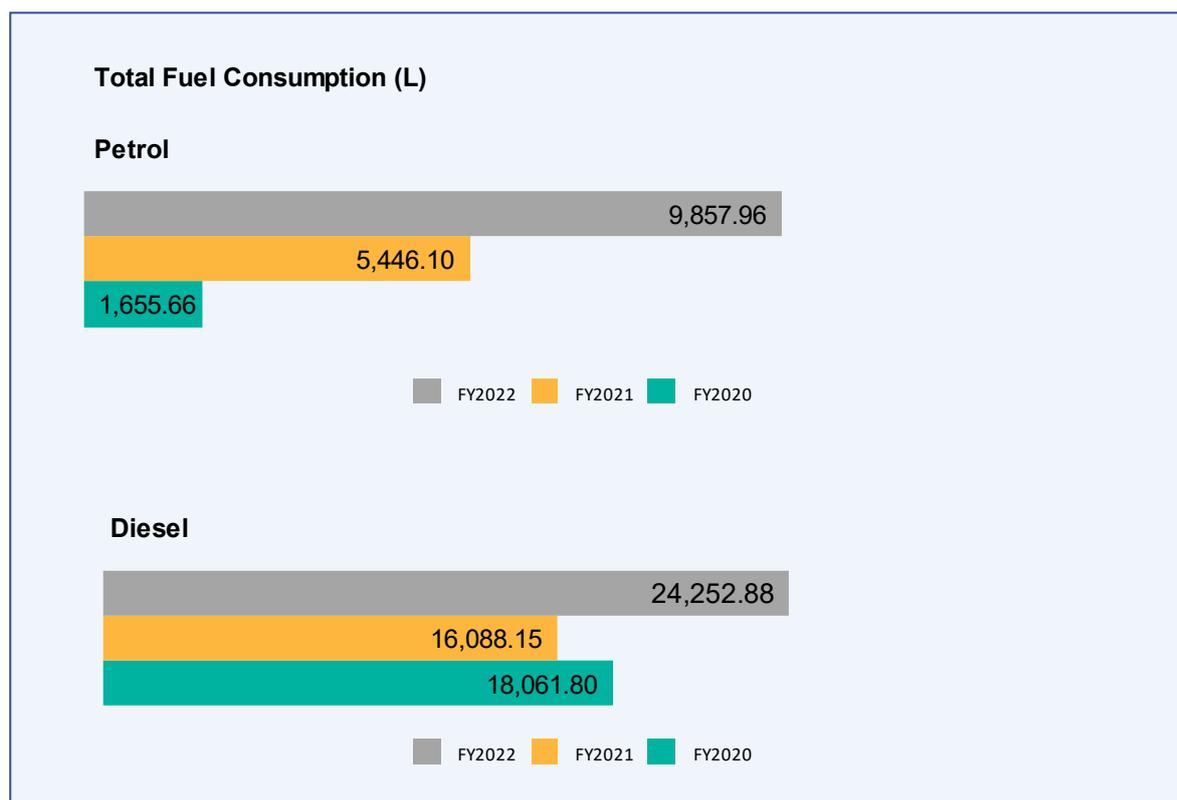

Scope 1 (Direct) Emissions

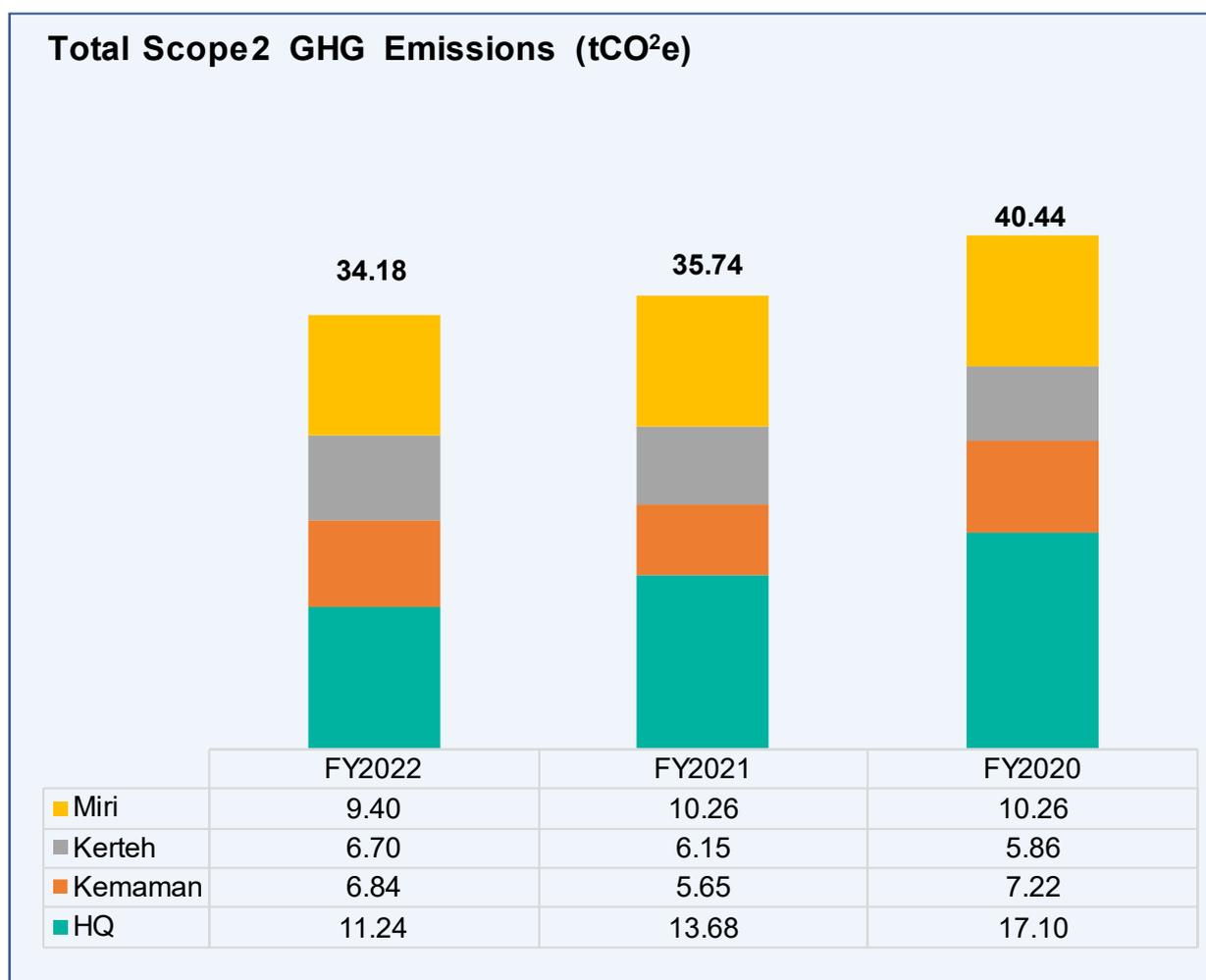


Scope 1 emissions are direct GHG emissions caused by the Group's vehicle fuel consumption. Steel Hawk's tracking data for fuel consumption has been used to calculate the total Scope 1 GHG emissions from 2020 until 2022 for this year's reporting. 2022 has seen an increase of as much as 31.89 tCO₂e compared to 2021 which has increased from 55.43 tCO₂e to 87.32 tCO₂e. 2021 has seen an increase of as much as 3.29 tCO₂e from 2020.



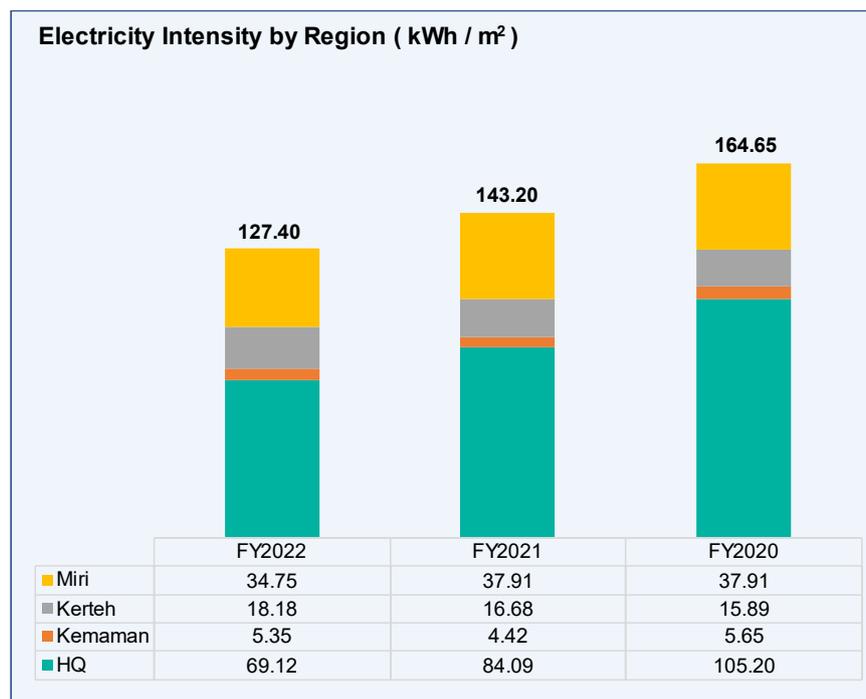
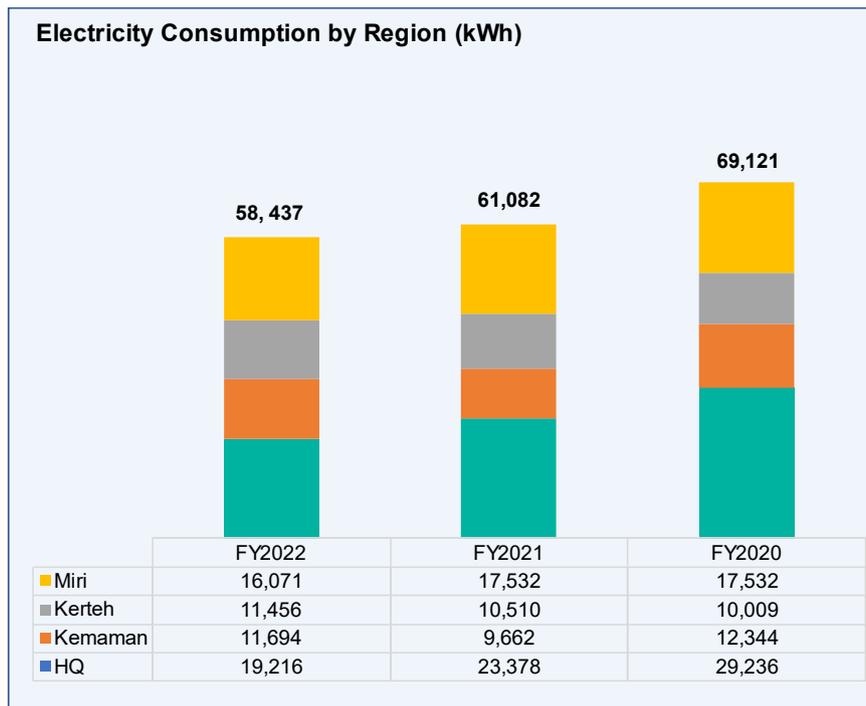
Our total fuel consumption tracking was conducted throughout the past three consecutive years to study the pattern of fuel usage in our facilities. Steel Hawk recorded 9,857.96 litres for petrol consumption compared to last year’s 5,446.10 litres, an increase of as much as 81%. Diesel consumption in 2022 is 24,252.88 litres, up from 16,085.15 litres last year. The variance between the two fuel types is 59.35%. The increase shown is due to our expansion into additional regions in 2022.

Scope 2 Emissions



Scope 2 emissions represent indirect GHG emissions associated with electricity generation from the grid. The decrease in Scope 2 GHG emissions is a result of the decrease in electricity consumption and intensity. In 2022, Steel Hawk recorded a decrease of 1.56 tCO²e compared to the year before. There was also a decrease in Scope 2 GHG emissions from 2020 to 2021 with a difference of 4.7 tCO²e.

Electricity Consumption and Intensity



Throughout 2022, the total electricity consumption was 58,437 kWh, or 127.40 kWh per square metre. This year's electrical consumption has decreased by 2,645 kWh (4.33%) compared to last year, and by 19.06 % compared to 2020.

The electricity intensity, at 127.40 kWh per square metre compared to last year's 143.20 kWh per square metre is a reduction of 15.80 kWh per square metre (11.03%). The reduction in electricity intensity proves efficiency despite the increase in operations. This analysis will allow us to rationalise the facilities' consumption pattern and develop eco-efficiency strategies to attain optimal consumption and desired energy usage.

Water Consumption

As we acknowledge the potential for water scarcity and its implication for our generations, we have put in place the necessary measures to track our water consumption in FY2023. For the current reporting year, we have installed water-efficient taps in our washrooms with built-in flow restrictors that reduce water flow and decrease wastage. We also understand the importance of raising water awareness amongst our workforce. Thus, we have initiated water efficiency discussions at team meetings and placed water awareness posters on the walls of high-traffic shared spaces.

Our Achievements

Steel Hawk Berhad has gotten off to a solid start and is on course to continue scaling new heights of success as we progress along the sustainability path. For 2022, we successfully upheld compliance and fostered a culture of ethical conduct within our governance. This year we have enhanced our stance on corporate ethics with the signing of the Corporate Integrity Pledge (“CIP”). In addition, we considered the social aspects of our workforce and provided multiple employee benefits including training and development. This also occurred in the form of gender participation equality and fostering a safe working environment. For the community, we invested in educational funding among the less fortunate children, and for our suppliers, we prioritised contributing to the local economy. By promoting cycling among our staff as part of a green initiative, we have also demonstrated our commitment to protecting the environment. Steel Hawk will continue to generate value for our stakeholders while simultaneously increasing our (ESG) performance by capitalising on our leadership abilities, capabilities, and strong market position.

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
